Ram Kumari was born in Mombasa on the 1st December 1930, the eldest of five children. She married at the age of eighteen to Ram Parkash Rawal. They moved from Mombasa to India when Kenya gained independence. After a short time in Ludhiana they moved to England, living in Birmingham and then later in Manchester. After Ram Parkash passed away, Ram Kumari settled in Cheadle Hulme close to family.

Ram Kumari had seven children, nine grandchildren and six great grandchildren. She was kind and loving and always stressed the importance of education. She was known as "knitting grandma" and loved gardening, food, tea, watching Wimbledon and the news.

She lived a remarkable life and her legacy lives on through her family.
