The bridegroom and bride each say:

I have.

Joseph, are you resolved to take Eleanor to be your wife: to love her, comfort her, honour and protect her, and forsaking all others, to be faithful to her, as long as you both shall live?

The bridegroom replies:

I am.

Eleanor, are you resolved to take Joseph to be your husband: to love him, comfort him, honour and protect him, and forsaking all others, to be faithful to him, as long as you both shall live?

The bride replies:

I am.

Are you prepared to accept children lovingly from God and to bring them up according to the law of Christ and his Church?

The bridegroom and bride each say:

I am.

THE CIVIL DECLARATION OF FREEDOM

I declare that I know of no legal reason why I, Joseph Lewis Christopher Mather, may not be joined in marriage to Eleanor Mary John.

I declare that I know of no legal reason why I, Eleanor Mary John, may not be joined in marriage to Joseph Lewis Christopher Mather.
