You made Mum laugh every day with your morning chorus as you entered the room, bringing your humorous aura with you. I shall always be blessed and laugh with the times you would say 'hop on lovey' and we would both sit on your mobility scooler to ride together or wheelie it, with appalled looks from passers-by.

You are greatly missed by all, especially Mum, having met with you both in your teens, you've shared 63 years of doting, honest, dedicated love for each other. Being by each other's side in your wondrous 58 years of marriage, you have shared many of the most special memories together. You were always there for each other with respect, listened to each other, understood each other, allowed each other space to be yourselves in what you both loved, and supported one another throughout. You would both help one another in what each other could not do for themselves, you were each other's rocks.

Remember to express gratitude for, and how much you love each other, to those nearest and dearest to you every day, so there is peace in knowing and no regrets. Dad and I were blessed to share this daily with 'I love you, and I love you more'.
