The badeken is a short but meaningful ritual where the groom covers the bride's face with her veil.

CIRCLING

The bride will circle the groom seven times. This represents building a wall of love around the couple's relationship.

OPENING ADDRESS

KIDDUSHIN (BLESSINGS OF BETROTHAL)

Two cups of wine are used in the wedding ceremony. The first cup accompanies the betrothal blessings, recited by the Rabbi. After these are recited, the couple drinks from the cup.

GIVING OF THE RING

The circle of the ring is a symbol of the eternal bond between husband and wife. It is a reminder of the love and commitment they share.

READING OF THE KETUBAH (THE MARRIAGE CONTRACT)

SHEVA BRACHOT

The Seven Blessings (Sheva Brachot) are now recited over the second cup of wine. These blessings are very ancient and set the bride and groom into a wider social and sacred context.

IM ESHKACHECH YERUSHALAYIM

Song of remembrance.

BREAKING OF THE GLASS

This is the most prominent part of a Jewish wedding ceremony and involves the groom smashing a glass with his foot! This is the official time for everyone to cheer, shout or exclaim "Mazal Tov," and start celebrating the happy couple!
