The Preface

Marriage is a gift of God in creation through which husband and wife may know the grace of God. It is given that as man and woman grow together in love and trust, they shall be united with one another in heart, body and mind, as Christ is united with his bride, the Church.

All: The gift of marriage brings husband and wife together in delight and tenderness and in joyful commitment to the end of their lives. Marriage is given as the foundation of family life in which children are nurtured and in which each member of the family, in good times and bad, may find strength, companionship and comfort, and grow to maturity in love.

Marriage is a way of life made holy by God, and blessed by the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ with those celebrating a wedding at Cana in Galilee.

All: Marriage is a sign of unity and loyalty which all should uphold and honour. Marriage enriches society and strengthens community. No one should enter into it lightly or selfishly but reverently and responsibly in the sight of almighty God.

Bevan and Sarah are now to enter this way of life. They will each give their consent to the other and make solemn vows and in token of this they will give and receive a ring. We pray with them that the Holy Spirit will guide and strengthen them, so that they may fulfil God's purposes for the whole of their earthly life together.

The minister says to the congregation:

First, I am required to ask anyone present who knows a reason why these persons may not lawfully marry, to declare it now.

The minister says to the couple:

The vows you are about to take are to be made in the presence of God, who is judge of all and knows all the secrets of our hearts; therefore if either of you knows a reason why you may not lawfully marry, you must declare it now.

The Collect

The minister invites the people to pray:

God our maker, from the beginning, you have blessed creation with abundant life. Pour out your blessings upon Bevan and Sarah, that they may be joined in mutual love and companionship, in holiness and commitment to each other. We ask this through our friend and companion Jesus Christ.

All: Amen.

The Declarations

The minister says to the bridegroom:

Bevan, will you take Sarah to be your wife? Will you love her, comfort her, honour and protect her, and forsaking all others, be faithful to her as long as you both shall live?

He answers: I will.

The minister says to the bride:

Sarah, will you take Bevan to be your husband? Will you love him, comfort him, honour and protect him, and, forsaking all others, be faithful to him as long as you both shall live?

She answers: I will.

The minister says to the congregation:

Will you, the families and friends of Bevan and Sarah, support and uphold them in their marriage now and in the years to come?

All: We will.

The Vows

The bridegroom takes the bride's right hand in his:

I, Bevan Charles Norwood, take you,
Sarah Catherine Hepworth, to be my wife,
to have and to hold from this day forward;
for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer,
in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish,
till death us do part; according to God's holy law.
In the presence of God I make this vow.

The bride takes the bridegroom's right hand in hers:

I, Sarah Catherine Hepworth, take you,
Bevan Charles Norwood, to be my husband,
to have and to hold from this day forward;
for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer,
in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish,
till death us do part; according to God's holy law.
In the presence of God I make this vow.

The Giving of Rings

The minister receives the rings, and says:

Holy Spirit of God, by your blessing, may these rings be to
Bevan and Sarah a symbol of unending love and faithfulness,
to remind them of the vow and covenant which they have
made this day through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

*The bridegroom places the ring on the fourth finger
of the bride's left hand and, holding it there, says:*

Sarah, I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage.
With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you,
and all that I have I share with you, within the love
of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

They loose hands and the bride places a ring on the fourth finger of the bridegroom's left hand and, holding it there, says:
Bevan, I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage.
With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you,
and all that I have I share with you, within the love
of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The Blessing of the Marriage

God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, bless, preserve and keep you; the Lord mercifully grant you the riches of his grace, that you may please him both in body and soul, and, living together in faith and love, may receive the blessings of eternal life.
