Burial at Tithe Green

Martin was laid to rest at a private service at 1pm on Friday 9th February at Tithe Green Burial Ground. This is an award-winning site in Calverton, Nottinghamshire, spread across 36 acres of stunning woodland and meadow areas. Opened 20 years ago, the site is situated within Sherwood Forest and is a rich haven for wildlife.

In early March, when the tree planting season starts at Tithe Green, the Gately family will return and place a fruiting Crabapple tree and a discreet name plaque to mark Martin's final resting place.

We will also be sowing seeds and planting bulbs.

Eve has picked the Crabapple from the sites list of suggested trees and on further research, we discovered to our delight that Crabapple symbolises:

"A foragers delight - a symbol of fertility & long associated with fidelity in love and marriage - giving plentiful blossom and neat exquiste apple-shaped fruit that makes jewel coloured jelly and jams".

Martin wanted to be "returned to nature" in the ancient traditions of the Green Man of the Forest.

Martin - be at peace my darling, in the sweet English soil.


Shirley picked this classic song as it brings back many happy memories of long hot summer holidays spent with Terry and Martin on the Cornish coast.


