To satisfy Will's amateur historian ambitions, we have also provided some (brief) information about the cathedral and Blackfriars below.

Gloucester Cathedral was originally built as an abbey in around 679 AD by Osric, the king of the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Hwicce, and later became used by Benedictine monks. Following a devastating fire, the Abbot William Serlo was appointed by William the Conqueror to carry out a major building project, including the expansive Norman Arches in the nave.

The cathedral has been the site of many historical events, including the initial assembly of the Domesday Book and the coronation of Henry III, as well as being the final resting place of Edward II who was infamously murdered in nearby Berkeley Castle. More recently, the cathedral has served as the filming location for the Harry Potter films, with the cathedral cloisters acting as the entrance to the Chamber of Secrets.

Blackfriars Priory was completed in 1270 as a home for Dominican friars (we have a range of monastic orders to choose from today). It has been used as a house, a weaving and bottling factory, and has one of the largest surviving scriptoriums (monk libraries) in the world. Today it hosts speaking events and epic wedding celebrations.
