OBITUARY

Michael Mccarrick, 67 years old, paased away on Saturday 29th June 2024, at the Luton and Dunstable Hospital, following a short battle with cancer and Parkinsons Disease.

Michael was born in January 1957 in Luton, to the late Terry and Irene McCarrick. He was the third of four children - brother to Sean, Martin and Lynn. Michael married Diana in October 1976 and had one child, Angela, born in 1980.

MIchael spent a short time in the Navy before changing career to work for Leagrave Press. In 1981, he began working at SKF where he remained until April 2020 when he retired.

Michael had a love of nature and wildlife, This began with volunteering alongside The Wildlife Trust and Luton Conservation Volunteers before supporting and leading local badger groups. Michael became a wildlife warrior in his support of badgers and foxes. He regularly camped out in the badger cull zones and helped local saboteur groups in preventing the barbaric hunting of foxes. He also attended protests in London for both these causes.
