MEMORIAL CANDLES

In remembrance of those whom we love and whose memory we treasure this day: We light these five candles in honour of our Loved Ones no longer physically present with us: One for our Grief, one for our Courage, one for our Memories, one for our Love, and one for our Hope.

First Candle:

The First Candle represents our Grief. The pain of losing you is as intense as our love for you.

Second Candle:

The second candle represents the courage to confront our sorrow, to comfort each other, and to forever live our lives with gratitude for your time with us.

Third Candle:

The third candle we light in your memory; the times we laughed, the times we cried, the funny things you did and the inspiration, caring and joy you gave us.

Fourth Candle:

Fifth Candle:
