ST. MARY'S, WIMBLEDON

Welcome to St. Mary's Church

St. Mary's Church, Wimbledon boasts a rich history dating back to the Domesday Book of 1086, where it is simply recorded as "there is a church." This initial structure was likely a modest wooden building, reflecting the small population of Wimbledon at the time.

The church underwent significant renovations from the late 13th century through the Victorian era to accommodate Wimbledon's growing community.

During restoration work in the 1860s, medieval rafters were discovered in the chancel roof. These rafters, painted with a distinctive chevron design, were likely part of the original 13th-century church.

The oldest memorial is an undated tablet low down in the north wall of the chancel dedicated to Philip and Margaret Lewston. It was inserted some time after 1537. Other notable memorials include William Wilberforce, philanthropist and slave trade abolitionist, Sir Joseph William Bazalgette, the engineer of Putney Bridge and the London sewage system, and Kathleen (Kitty) and Leslie Godfree, Wimbledon champions winning the ladies' singles, the mixed doubles, and gentlemen's doubles.

The beautiful embroidered kneelers, all 350 of them, were the work of parishioners in the late 1980's. Look for a special kneeler made to commemorate the visit of Pope John Paul II to Wimbledon in 1982.

The pews date from the rebuilding in the 1840's. Richard Milward writes that they are described as 'the most uncomfortable pews in the whole of Christendom'! Soon, there will be an addition of a Womble gargoyle depticting Tobermory on the South West
