The Liturgy of Baptism: Introduction and Address by Reverend Chantal Mason

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome Dexter and Rita and uphold them in their new life in Christ?

All: With the help of God, we will.

The minister then says to the parents and godparents:

The Church receives Dexter and Rita with joy. Today we are trusting God for their growth in faith. Will you pray for them, draw them by your example into the community of faith and walk with her in the way of Christ?

Godparents: With the help of God, we will.

In baptism Dexter and Rita begin their journey of faith. You speak for them today. Will you care for them, and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

Godparents: With the help of God, we will.

The Decision: The minister addresses the parents and godparents:

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore, I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God? **Godparents: I reject them.**

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? **Godparents: I reject them.**

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

Godparents: I reject them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? **Godparents: I turn to Christ.**

Do you submit to Christ as Lord? **Godparents: I submit to Christ.**

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life? **Godparents: I come to Christ.**

Signing with the Cross: The minister makes the sign of the cross on Dexter and Rita's foreheads, saying:

Dexter and Rita, Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

The parents and godparents are invited to sign Dexter and Rita with the cross

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

All: Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,

restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

All: Amen.

Prayer over the Water: The minister stands before the water of baptism and says:

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All: who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Almighty God, whose Son Jesus Christ was baptised in the river Jordan, we thank you for the gift of water to cleanse us and revive us. Saving God,

All: Give us life.

We thank you that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the Promised Land. Saving God,

All: Give us life.

We thank you that through the deep waters of death you brought your Son, and raised him to life in triumph. Saving God, All: Give us life.

Bless this water, that your servant who is washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and in his resurrection,

to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Saving God, All: Give us life.

Send your Holy Spirit upon Dexter and Rita bring them to new birth in the household of faith and raise them with Christ to full and eternal life; for all might, majesty, authority and power are yours, now and for ever.
