PREFACE

The bride and bridegroom stand before the priest [all remaining standing]

The priest says

We have come together in the presence of God, to witness the marriage of Josh and Ellie, to ask his blessing on them, and to share in their joy. Our Lord Jesus Christ was himself a guest at a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and through his Spirit he is with us now.

The Bible teaches us that marriage is a gift of God in creation and a means of his grace, a holy mystery in which man and woman become one flesh. It is God's purpose that, as husband and wife give themselves to each other in love throughout their lives, they shall be united in that love as Christ is united with his Church.

Marriage is given, that husband and wife may comfort and help each other, living faithfully together in need and in plenty, in sorrow and in

joy. It is given, that with delight and tenderness they may know each other in love, and, through the joy of their bodily union, may strengthen the union of their hearts and lives. It is given as the foundation of family life in which children may be born and nurtured in accordance with God's will, to his praise and glory.

In marriage husband and wife belong to one another, and they begin a new life together in the community. It is a way of life that all should honour; and it must not be undertaken carelessly, lightly, or selfishly, but reverently, responsibly, and after serious thought.

This is the way of life, created and hallowed by God, that Josh and Ellie are now to begin. They will each give their consent to the other; they will join hands and exchange solemn vows, and in token of this they will [each] give and receive a ring.

Therefore, on this their wedding day we pray with them, that, strengthened and guided by God, they may fulfil his purpose for the whole of their earthly life together.

THE DECLARATIONS

The priest says to the congregation

First, I am required to ask anyone present who knows a reason why Joshua and Emmanuelle may not lawfully marry, to declare it now.

The priest says to the couple

The vows you are about to take are to be made in the presence of God, who is judge of all and who knows all the secrets of our hearts: therefore, if either of you knows a reason why you may not lawfully marry, you must declare it now.

The priest says to the bride

Emmanuelle Rebecca Ford, will you take Joshua Luke Harper to be your husband? Will you love him, comfort him, honour and protect him, and, forsaking all others, be faithful to him as long as you both shall live?

She answers

I will.

The priest says to the bridegroom

Joshua Luke Harper, will you take Emmanuelle Rebecca Ford to be your wife? Will you love her, comfort her, honour and protect her, and, forsaking all others, be faithful to her as long as you both shall live?

He answers

I will.

The priest says to the congregation

Will you the families and friends of Joshua and Emmanuelle, support and uphold them in their marriage now and in the years to come?

All **We will**

Tony says 'I do' and steps forward to pass Ellie's hand to Josh.

VOWS

The priest says:

Joshua and Emmanuelle, I now invite you to join hands and make your vows, in the presence of God and his people.

The bride takes the bridegroom's right hand in hers, and says

I, Emmanuelle Rebecca Ford, take you, Joshua Luke Harper, to be my husband, to have and to hold from this day forward; for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy law; in the presence of God I make this vow.

They loose hands.

The bridegroom takes the bride's right hand in his, and says

I, Joshua Luke Harper, take you, Emmanuelle Rebecca Ford, to be my wife, to have and to hold from this day forward for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part, according to God's holy law; in the presence of God I make this vow.

They loose hands.

THE GIVING OF RINGS

The priest receives the rings from Josh's Groomsman, Josh Gwillam, and says this prayer

Heavenly Father, by your blessing, let these rings be to Joshua and Emmanuelle a symbol of unending love and faithfulness, to remind them of the vow and covenant which they have made this day; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Josh places a ring on Ellie's fourth finger, and holding it there, says

Ellie, I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage. With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Josh, I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage. With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

THE PROCLAMATION

The priest addresses the people.

In the presence of God, and before this congregation, Josh and Ellie have given their consent and made their marriage vows to each other. They have declared their marriage by the joining of hands and by the giving and receiving of rings. I therefore proclaim that they are husband and wife.

The priest joins their right hands together and says

Those whom God has joined together let no one put asunder.

THE BLESSING OF THE MARRIAGE

Josh and Ellie kneel and the priest blesses them

God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit, bless, preserve, and keep you; the Lord mercifully grant you the riches of his grace, that you may please him both in body and soul, and, living together in faith and love, may receive the blessings of eternal life.
