DECLARATION

Bridal party stand

Ti: Neil and Debra, with your families and friends, we thank God on this day for the gift of marriage. It is the will of God that, in marriage, husband and wife should experience a unity of heart, body and mind; comfort and companionship; enrichment and encouragement; tenderness and trust. It is the will of God that marriage should be honoured as a way of life in which we may know the security of love and care. No one should enter into this lightly or selfishly for marriage involves the giving of a man and a woman wholeheartedly to each other. Christ in His self-giving comes to our help, for He loves us and gave himself for us.

Neil: With God's help, I will.

Ti to Debra: Debra, are you willing to give yourself in marriage to Neil?

Debra: I am

Ti to Debra: Will you love him, comfort and honour him, be his companion through all the joys and sorrows of life, and be faithful to him as long as you both shall live?

Debra: With God's help, I will.

THE MARRIAGE

All stand

Ti: I ask you, the families and friends of Neil and Debra: Will you do all in your power to support and encourage them in their marriage?

All: With God's help, we will.

Ti: Who presents Debra to be married to Neil?

Peter McCormick: I do.

All be seated except the bride and groom

Ti: Gracious God, as you have brought Neil and Debra together in love and trust, enable them through the power of Your Holy Spirit to make and keep their vows; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Neil takes Debra's right hand in his and says:

I Neil Thomas Welch, take you, Debra Susan Skade, to be my wedded wife, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, from this day forward, until we are parted by death; and this is my solemn vow.

Debra takes Neil's right hand in hers and says:

I Debra Susan Skade, take you, Neil Thomas Welch, to be my wedded husband, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, from this day forward, until we are parted by death; and this is my solemn vow.

THE GIVING OF THE RINGS

All stand

Ti: Who has the rings?

Jon Bell places the rings on the book

Ti: Eternal God, bless these rings that they may be a symbol of love and trust between Neil and Debra.

All: Amen.

Neil places the ring on Debra's finger and says:

I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage. All that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Debra places the ring on Neil's finger and says:

I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage. All that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Ti joins the right hands of both together and says:

Neil and Debra, God so join you together that none shall ever part you. Before God and in the presence of us all, Neil and Debra have exchanged vows, joined their hands, and given and received rings, binding themselves to each other in the covenant of marriage. I therefore proclaim that they are now husband and wife.

Applause & kiss

Ti joins the right hands of both together and says:

Neil and Debra, the blessing of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, be upon you and remain with you always. May God be your protection and your wisdom, your guide and your peace, your joy, your comfort, and your eternal rest. **Amen.**
