HOMILY

RITE OF MARRIAGE

Priest: Dear Olivia and James, you have come to this Church so that the Lord may seal your love in the presence of the Priest and this community.

Christian marriage is a sacred union which enriches natural love. It binds those who enter it to be faithful to each other forever; it creates between them a bond that endures for life and cannot be broken; it demands that they love and honour each other, that they accept from God the children he may give them, and bring them up in his love.

To help them in their marriage the husband and wife receive the life-long grace of the sacrament.

Is this your understanding of marriage?

Olivia and James: It is.

Priest: Olivia and James, you are about to exchange your marriage vows. Have you come here of your own free will and choice and without compulsion to marry each other?

Olivia and James: We have.

Priest: Will you love and honour each other in marriage all the days of your life?

Olivia and James: We will.

Priest: Are you willing to accept with love the children God may send you and bring them up in accordance with the law of Christ and his Church?

Olivia and James: We are.

DECLARATION OF CONSENT

Priest: I invite you then to declare before God and his Church your consent to become husband and wife.

Priest: James, do you take Olivia as your wife, for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, all the days of your life?
