Thank you for your extremely nice letter offering your resignation from 6 September. I am delighted that you have achieved your ambition of setting on a clinical psychology training course.

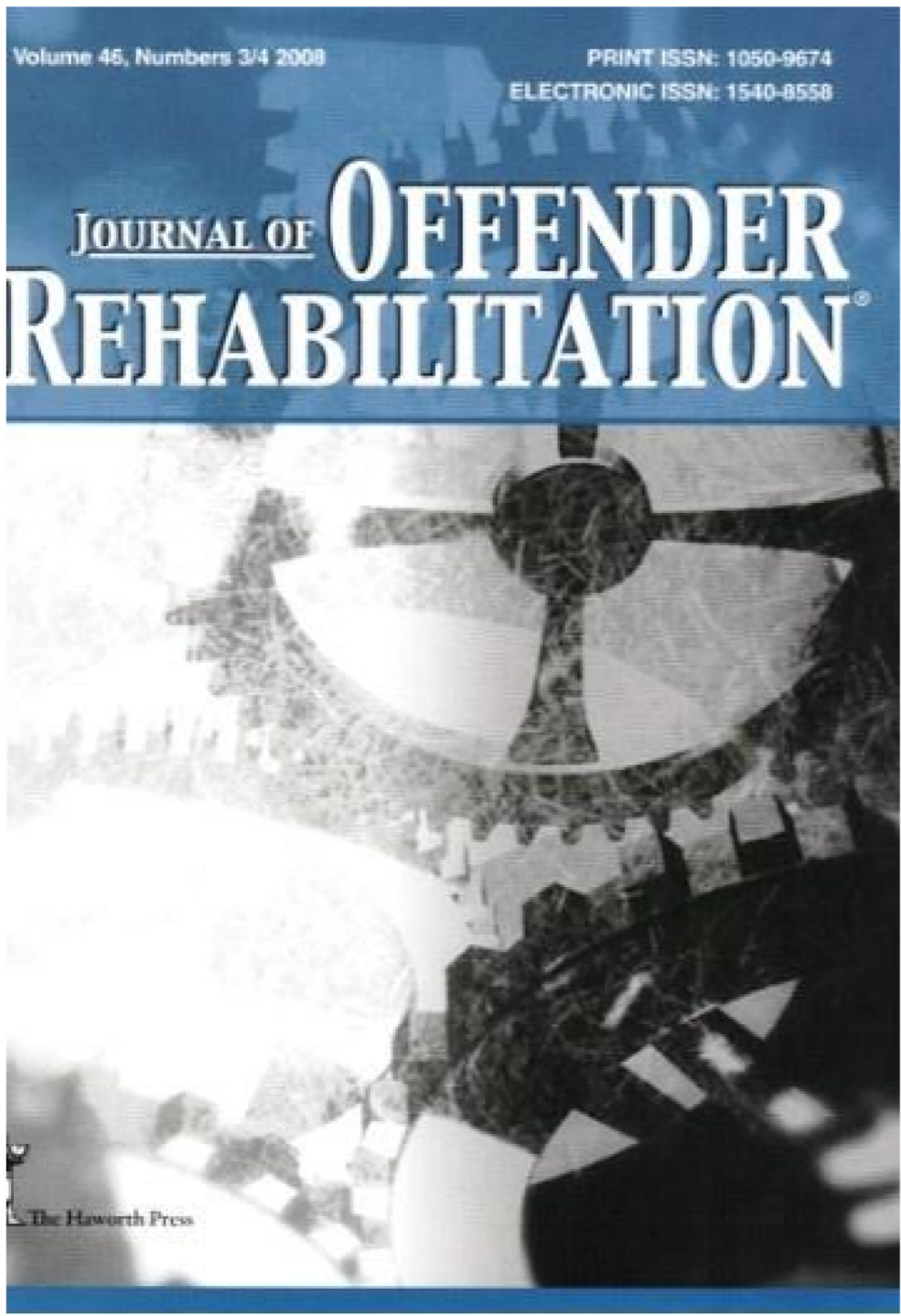
