There are things in life we try to give our children. One is roots and another is wings. Kirsty you have grown your wings and fled the nest, but you will always be loved and have your roots in our family.

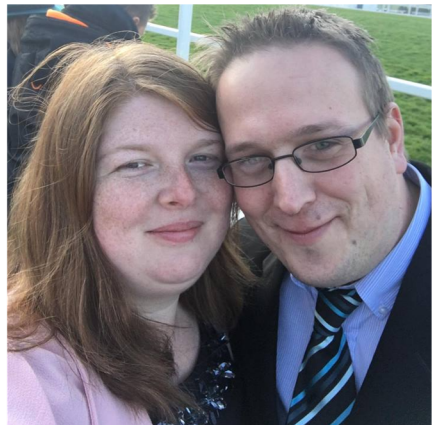
