HYMN - Thine be the Glory

Originally written by Swiss Protestant minister, Edmond Budry in 1884, 'Thine Be the Glory' was translated into English nearly 40 years later in 1923 by Richard Birch Hoyle (1875–1939). It is set to the tune of the chorus "See, the Conqu'ring hero comes" from the third section of Handel's oratorio Judas Maccabaeus.
