The family moved to live in Bridge House on the River Lea Ponders End, in 1934. Their younger brother John would arrive in 1939.

It was the perfect playground for children and the family lived there until the 1950s. During this time, they would attend Alma School.


In 1950, Fred was sent to Iserlohn in Germany for his National Service, where he served for two years in the 10th Royal Hussars regiment. He would become proficient in rifle competitions.

Upon completing his service, Fred would marry his first wife, Margaret in 1953. They would have three children, Richard, born in 1956, followed by David in 1965, and Robert in 1967.

In 1975 he remarried, to Carol, who sadly passed away in 1977. Fred would meet Sue, who was the landlady of the Hop Poles in Enfield and would later be married in 1981. They would have one child, Gary, in 1984. Sue would pass away in 1997.

Fred's boys gave him four Grandchildren: Christopher, Tara, Louisa, and Take.

He would work as a Heavy Goods driver for the majority of his life and his sons would enjoy going to work with their dad during the School Holidays. Fred was a resilient, and strong-willed man throughout his life. He was a lifelong supporter of Tottenham Hotspur and would take Richard to games as a child. In later years, he would again attend games with his sons, right up until late 2023. His last match would see Spurs win 2-1 at home to Sheffield United.
