On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So, they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now." This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

After this he went down to Capernaum, with his mother and his brothers and his disciples, and they stayed there for a few days.

The Celebration of Marriage

Dearly beloved, you have come together into the house of the Church, so that in the presence of the Church's minister and the community your intention to enter into Marriage may be strengthened by the Lord with a sacred seal.

Christ abundantly blesses the love that binds you. Through a special Sacrament, he enriches and strengthens those he has already consecrated by Holy Baptism, that they may be faithful to each other for ever and assume all the responsibilities of married life.

And so, in the presence of the Church, I ask you to state your intentions.

The Questions before the Consent

Hannah and Richard, have you come here to enter into Marriage without coercion, freely and wholeheartedly?

Both reply "I am."

Addressing the bridegroom, the minister says:

Richard, are you resolved to take Hannah to be your wife: to love her, comfort her, honour and protect her, and forsaking all others, to be faithful to her as long as you both shall live?

The bridegroom replies "I am."

Next, the minister asks the bride:

Hannah, are you resolved to take Richard to be your husband: to love him, comfort him, honour and protect him, and forsaking all others, to be faithful to him as long as you both shall live?

The bride replies: "I am."

Addressing the bridegroom and bride, the minister asks:

Are you prepared to accept children lovingly from God and to bring them up according to the law of Christ and his Church?

The bridegroom and bride each say: "I am."

The Civil Declaration of Freedom

The bridegroom repeats the following after the minister:

I do solemnly declare that I know not of any lawful impediment why I, Richard Thackray, may not be joined in matrimony to Hannah Coupland

The bride repeats the following after the minister:

I do solemnly declare that I know not of any lawful impediment why I, Hannah Coupland, may not be joined in matrimony to Richard Thackray

The Consent

Since it is your intention to enter the covenant of Holy Matrimony, join your right hands and declare your consent before God and his Church.

The bridegroom says:

I call upon these persons here present to witness that I, Richard Thackray, do take thee, Hannah Coupland, to be my lawful wedded wife, to have and to hold from this day forward for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish till death us do part.

The bride says:

I call upon these persons here present to witness
that I, Hannah Coupland, do take thee, Richard Thackray,
to be my lawful wedded husband,
to have and to hold from this day forward
for better, for worse,
for richer, for poorer,
in sickness and in health,
to love and to cherish
till death us do part.

The Reception of Consent

May the Lord in his kindness strengthen the consent you have declared before
the Church, and graciously bring to fulfilment his blessing within you.
What God joins together, let no one put asunder.

The Nuptial Blessing

May her husband entrust his heart to her, so that, acknowledging her as his equal and his joint heir to the life of grace, he may show her due honour and cherish her always with the love that Christ has for his Church.

And now, Lord, we implore you: may these your servants hold fast to the faith and keep your commandments, made one in the flesh, may they be blameless in all they do; and with the strength that comes from the Gospel, may they bear true witness to Christ before all; may they be blessed with children, and prove themselves virtuous parents, who live to see their children's children.

And grant that, reaching at last together the fulness of years
for which they hope, they may come to the life of the blessed in
the Kingdom of Heaven.
