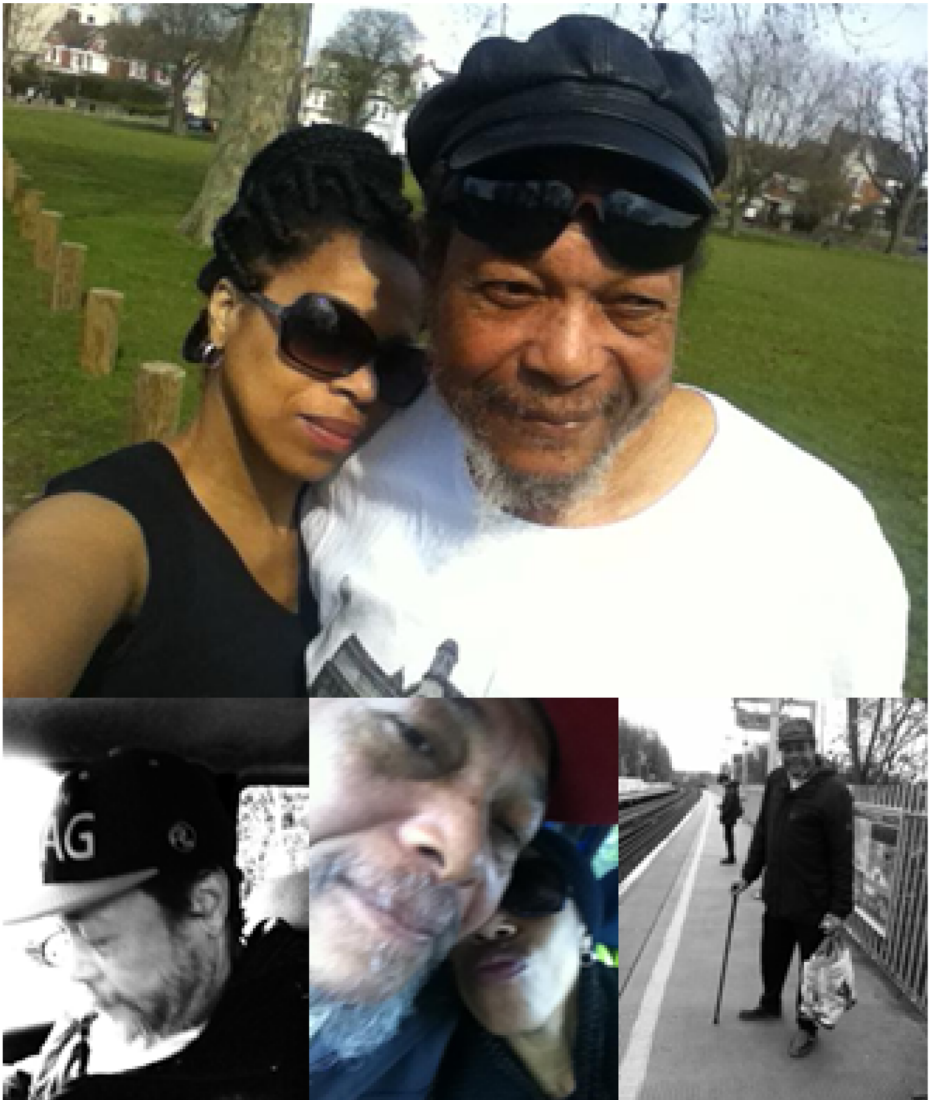
#### ***The Peace of Wild Things***
