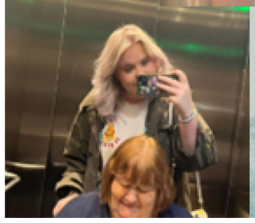
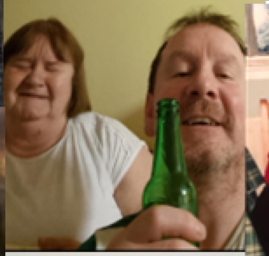
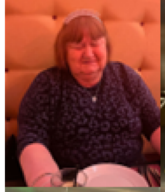
A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew.

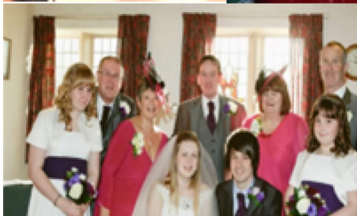
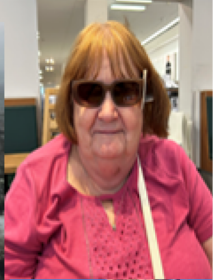
